## **Railponsible Charter**

### **Introduction**

Railponsible is a sustainable procurement initiative for the Railway Industry.

The purpose of this Charter is to describe the initiative and to formally state the common commitments of the member companies who are a part of the initiative.

Chief Procurement Officers (or Chief Executive Officers/Chief Operating Officers, where relevant) sign this Charter when joining Railponsible, thus formally demonstrating their companies' commitment to the initiative and its vision and mission.

### **Scope**

The initiative focuses on the sustainability of the railway industry's global supply chain, covering all products and services.

By 'Sustainability', the initiative is in alignment with the definition of the United Nations Global Compact, which refers to ten principles in the areas of human rights, labor, environment, and anti-corruption.

### **Vision**

Members of Railponsible believe that sustainable procurement is a key driver of value for business and society.

Our vision is a global railway industry where all suppliers have in place good ethical, social, environmental and business practices.

### **Mission**

To continuously improve the sustainability practices of railway industry suppliers.

To share best practices and processes, driving a shared understanding across the industry.

To use and share common tools, creating efficiencies.



## Commitments

### Member company commitment

- » The Chief Procurement Officer of each member organization formally commits to the vision and mission of the initiative.
- » The sustainability expectations we require of our suppliers are also reflected in our own practices.
- » We have resources in place whose responsibility it is to effectively implement supply chain sustainability within our companies and with our suppliers.
- » We operate in compliance with antitrust laws and Railsponsible Antitrust statement. It is not the aim/purpose of the initiative to use the meetings for purposes that could in any reasonable way be seen as anti-trust behavior.

### Operational commitment

- » We encourage our suppliers to participate in the common assessment program, to send a common message and reduce duplication for suppliers.
- » We commit to use tools developed by this initiative in a manner consistent with our own processes.

### Reporting commitment

- » We report regularly on an aggregate view of the sustainability performance of our supply chains.

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
